RIDDOR is a policy set by the government to help promote a safe and healthy environment. The policy states that all serious illness that require hospital treatment or are listed on the infectious diseases list held within the Doctors, schools and after school club are reported to the setting. Then this information will be passed on to the correct department for further investigation and to ensure any dangerous diseases are contained and treated correctly.

RIDDOR is also in place to promote a safe environment as we will also report incidents as listed below,

- \*Fractures other than to fingers, thumbs and toes
- \*Amputations
- \*Any injury likely to lead to permanent loss of sight or reduction in sight
- \*Crush injury to the head or torso causing damage to the brain or internal organs
- \*Serious burns (including scalding) which: covers more than 10% of the body or causes significant damage to the eyes, respiratory system or other vital organs
- \*any scalping requiring hospital treatment
- \*loss of consciousness caused by head injury or asphyxia
- \*any other injury arising from working in an enclosed space which: leads to hypothermia or heat-induced illness
- \*resuscitation or admittance to hospital for more than 24 hours
